Talbot County - Oxford Community Services Building Loan of 2001

This emergency bill removes the requirement in the Talbot County – Oxford Community Services Building Loan of 2001 that the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Oxford, as grantee, grant and convey a perpetual preservation easement to the Maryland Historical Trust.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None. Removing the easement requirement would not directly affect State finances.

Local Effect: Minimal impact on the Town of Oxford.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law: Chapter 607 of 2001 authorizes up to \$150,000 in matching funds for the planning, design, reconstruction, repair, renovation, and capital equipping of, and construction of an addition to, a building located at 100 North Morris Street in Oxford, Maryland, for the Oxford Community Services Building. Chapter 607 requires the grantee to grant and convey a perpetual preservation easement to the Maryland Historical Trust.

Background: The Maryland Historical Trust advises that the building where the project is located, as renovated, will not be of historical significance and that an easement is not required. The grantee has already expended funds sufficient to meet the required match.
