#### **FISCAL NOTE**

House Bill 1275 Economic Matters (Delegate Barve, *et al.*)

#### **Restaurants - Caffeine-Free, Sugar-Free Soft Drinks Offered for Consumption**

This bill requires restaurants that offer regular or sugar-free soft drinks to also offer caffeine-free, sugar-free soft drinks. Violators are guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction subject to a penalty of up to \$500.

### **Fiscal Summary**

**State Effect:** Potential minimal increase in general fund revenues due to the bill's penalty provision. No effect on expenditures.

Local Effect: None.

**Small Business Effect:** Potential minimal increase in expenditures for businesses that would have to stock caffeine-free, sugar-free soft drinks.

#### Analysis

Current Law: There are not any laws that require businesses to sell specific items.
