Montgomery and Prince George's Counties - Boys' and Girls' Homes Loan of 2001

This emergency bill removes the requirement in the Montgomery and Prince George's Counties – Boys' and Girls' Homes Loan of 2001 that the Board of Directors of Boys' and Girls' Homes and Community Services, Inc., as grantee, grant and convey a perpetual preservation easement to the Maryland Historical Trust.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None. Removing the easement requirement would not directly affect State finances.

Local Effect: None.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law: Chapter 293 of 2001 authorized up to \$100,000 in matching funds to the grantee for the repair, renovation, reconstruction, and capital equipping of seven group homes for boys and girls in Montgomery and Prince George's counties, located at 2710 Norbeck Road in Silver Spring, 700 Hudson Avenue in Takoma Park, 635 Maryland Avenue in Rockville, 616 Hyde Road in Silver Spring, 4109 Queensbury Road in Hyattsville, 11320 Schuylkill Road in Rockville, and 5101 42nd Avenue in Hyattsville. Chapter 293 requires the grantee to grant and convey a perpetual preservation easement to the Maryland Historical Trust.

Background: The Maryland Historical Trust advises that the buildings that are the subject of the grant are not of historical significance, and the easement would not be needed.
