#### **Insurance - Life Insurance Producers - Pre-Need Contracts**

This bill authorizes licensed life insurance producers to sell or provide, through a preneed contract, pre-need funeral or burial services, or pre-need merchandise such as caskets.

### **Fiscal Summary**

**State Effect:** The bill would not directly affect State operations or finances.

Local Effect: None.

**Small Business Effect:** Potential meaningful.

### **Analysis**

**Current Law:** Under current law, an agreement for pre-need burial services may only be made between a consumer and a licensed funeral director, licensed mortician, or surviving spouse. A surviving spouse means the legal widow or widower of a licensed funeral director or licensed mortician whose license was in good standing at the time of death and who at the time of death wholly or partly owned and operated a mortuary science business.

**Small Business Effect:** The bill will have an impact to the extent that morticians and funeral homes that are small businesses lose sales for pre-need goods and services that are made instead by life insurance producers.
