**Background:** The Caribbean has the second highest rate of HIV and AIDS in the world after Sub-Saharan Africa. The Third Border Initiative, announced last year by the Bush Administration, set aside \$20 million in fiscal 2002 for HIV and AIDS prevention and education programs in the Caribbean.
