Maryland Day of Remembrance of the September 11, 2001 Terrorist Attacks

This joint resolution designates September 11 as “Maryland Day of Remembrance of the September 11, 2001 Terrorist Attacks.” On September 11 and throughout the year, parents and educators are encouraged to teach their children and students that the ideal of liberty in the United States, which the terrorists attempted to destroy on September 11, 2001, remains unscathed.

Fiscal Summary

Analysis

Background: The worst terrorist attacks on United States soil occurred on September 11, 2001 when four hijacked commercial airliners were crashed into the twin towers of the World Trade Center, the Pentagon, and a field in Pennsylvania. Thousands of American citizens were killed in the attacks. This joint resolution seeks to commemorate these tragic attacks by designating September 11 as the “Maryland Day of Remembrance of the September 11, 2001 Terrorist Attacks.”
