FISCAL NOTE

House Bill 257 Appropriations (The Speaker) (Governor's Salary Commission)

Constitutional Officers - Salary

This bill implements the salary recommendations of the Governor's Salary Commission for the Treasurer, Comptroller, Attorney General, and Secretary of State for the next following term of office.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: General fund expenditure increase of \$25,200 for salaries and fringe benefits in FY 2003, increasing to \$100,300 in FY 2007. Future years reflect annualization and statutory salary increases.

Analysis

Bill Summary: The bill would establish, in statute, the salaries of the Treasurer, Comptroller, Attorney General, and Secretary of State for each year of the next four-year term as follows:

Current Law: The salaries of the four constitutional officers: Treasurer, Comptroller, Attorney General, and Secretary of State are not established in statute, but are as provided for in the State budget. The current salaries, as provided in the Governor's fiscal 2003 budget, are: \$100,000 per year for the Treasurer, Comptroller, and Attorney General; and \$70,000 per year for the Secretary of State.

Background: The Governor's Salary Commission was created by a constitutional amendment in 1976. The commission is to make a written recommendation to the Governor on the salaries for the Governor and Lieutenant Governor within ten days after the beginning of the last regular legislative session of the term. The commission cannot recommend salary changes for the incumbent Governor and Lieutenant Governor. The commission's recommendation is to be introduced as a joint resolution in each House of the General Assembly no later than the fifteenth day of the session. If the commission recommends no change in the salaries, a resolution is not introduced.

Beginning with the 1981 Governor's Salary Commission, the commission has made recommendations, per the Governor's request, on salaries for four constitutional officers: State Treasurer, Comptroller of the Treasury, Attorney General, and Secretary of State. Governor Glendening requested that the 2001 Governor's Salary Commission review, and provide guidance on, the salaries of the constitutional officers.

In 1990 the joint resolution containing the recommendations of the 1989 Governor's Salary Commission was amended to provide the current statutory salaries for the Governor and Lieutenant Governor. The salaries currently provided in the State budget for the Treasurer, Comptroller, Attorney General, and Secretary of State reflect the recommendations of the 1989 Governor's Salary Commission as amended in the 1990 joint resolution.

The *Report of the 2001 Governor's Salary Commission*, published in January 2002, contains appendices showing the salaries and rankings for each of the constitutional officers in all 50 states. The rankings for Maryland by constitutional office based on current salaries are as follows:

| Comptroller | 9 |
| Attorney General | 16 |
| Secretary of State | 30 |

State Fiscal Effect: General fund expenditures will increase by \$25,200 in fiscal 2003 for salaries and fringe benefits reflecting the effective date of the start of the next term of office. This amount will grow in future years, reflecting annualization and the statutory salary increases, to \$100,300 in fiscal 2007.
