Environmental Matters

Health Occupations - Medical Review Committees - Civil Immunity

This bill specifies under what circumstances a person has immunity from liability for contributing to the function of a medical review committee.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: The bill would not directly affect governmental operations or finances.

Local Effect: None.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Bill Summary: A "contribution" to the function of a medical review committee includes any statement by any person, regardless of whether it is a direct communication with the committee, that is made within the context of the person's employment or is made to a person with a professional interest in the functions of the committee and is intended to lead to redress of a matter within the scope of the committee's functions.

Current Law: A medical review committee is: (1) a regulatory board or agency established by State or federal law to license, certify, or discipline a health care provider; or (2) another group of specified individuals that: (a) evaluates and seeks to improve the quality of health care provided by health care providers; (b) evaluates the need for and the level of performance of health care provided by health care providers; (c) evaluates

the qualifications, competence, and performance of health care providers; or (d) evaluates and acts on matters that relate to the discipline of any health care provider.

The proceedings, records, and files of a medical review committee are confidential and are not discoverable or admissible in evidence in any civil action arising out of matters that are being reviewed and evaluated by the committee.

A person has the immunity from liability for any action as a member of the medical review committee or for giving information to, participating in, or contributing to the function of the medical review committee.
