### AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL NO. 676

(First Reading File Bill)

## AMENDMENT NO. 1

On page 1, in line 2, after "Program -" insert "Maryland Pharmacy Access Hotline"; in lines 2 and 3, strike "Prior Authorization - Mental Health Drugs"; and strike beginning with "prohibiting" in line 4 down through "disorders." in line 11 and substitute "requiring the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene to establish a certain hotline; requiring the Department to distribute to Program recipients certain information about the hotline; requiring the Department to notify certain health care providers about the hotline; requiring the Department to develop a methodology to track the number and type of calls received by the hotline; requiring the Department to report quarterly to the Pharmacy and Therapeutics Committee on the number and type of calls received by the hotline; and generally relating to the Maryland Medical Assistance Program and the Maryland Pharmacy Access Hotline.

#### BY adding to

Article - Health - General

Section 15-136

Annotated Code of Maryland

(2000 Replacement Volume and 2002 Supplement)".

On pages 1 and 2, strike beginning with line 12 on page 1 through line 17 on page 2, inclusive.

## AMENDMENT NO. 2

On pages 2 through 6, strike beginning with line 21 on page 2 through line 37 on page 6, inclusive.

### AMENDMENT NO. 3

On page 6, after line 37, insert:

- (A) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL USE EXISTING RESOURCES TO ESTABLISH A TOLL FREE MARYLAND PHARMACY ACCESS HOTLINE THAT:
  - (1) OPERATES DURING REGULAR BUSINESS HOURS; AND
- (2) <u>DURING NONBUSINESS HOURS ALLOWS CALLERS TO LEAVE A</u> MESSAGE.
- (B) (1) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL DISTRIBUTE TO ALL PROGRAM RECIPIENTS INFORMATION ABOUT THE MARYLAND PHARMACY ACCESS HOTLINE.
- (2) THE INFORMATION SHALL STATE CLEARLY IN EASILY READABLE PRINT:
- (I) THE TOLL FREE TELEPHONE NUMBER OF THE HOTLINE; AND
- (II) THAT THE PROGRAM RECIPIENT SHOULD CALL THE TELEPHONE NUMBER IF THE PROGRAM RECIPIENT IS HAVING PROBLEMS GETTING NECESSARY MEDICINES.
- (C) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL NOTIFY ALL HEALTH CARE PROVIDERS WHO PARTICIPATE IN THE PROGRAM ABOUT THE MARYLAND PHARMACY ACCESS HOTLINE.
  - (D) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL:
- (1) DEVELOP A METHODOLOGY TO TRACK THE NUMBER AND TYPE OF CALLS RECEIVED BY THE MARYLAND PHARMACY ACCESS HOTLINE; AND
- (2) PROVIDE A QUARTERLY REPORT TO THE PHARMACY AND THERAPEUTICS COMMITTEE THAT SUMMARIZES THE NUMBER AND TYPE OF CALLS RECEIVED BY THE MARYLAND PHARMACY ACCESS HOTLINE.".
