On page 2, after line 5, insert:

"1A-302.

- (a) To qualify for a license, an applicant shall be an individual who meets the requirements of this section.
 - (b) The applicant shall:
 - (1) Be of good moral character;
 - (2) Be at least 18 years old;
- (3) Demonstrate competence in performing acupuncture by meeting one of the following standards for education or training:
- (i) Graduation from a course of training of at least 1,800 hours IN ACUPUNCTURE, including 300 clinical hours, that is:
 - 1. Approved by the Maryland Higher Education Commission;

- 2. Accredited by the [National Accreditation Commission for Schools and Colleges of Acupuncture and Oriental Medicine] ACCREDITATION COMMISSION FOR ACUPUNCTURE AND ORIENTAL MEDICINE; or
- 3. Found by the Board to be equivalent to a course approved by the [National Accreditation Commission for Schools and Colleges of Acupuncture and Oriental Medicine] ACCREDITATION COMMISSION FOR ACUPUNCTURE AND ORIENTAL MEDICINE; or
 - (ii) Achievement of a [passing score on an examination that is]:
- 1. [Given by the National Commission for the Certification of Acupuncturists] DIPLOMATE IN ACUPUNCTURE FROM THE NATIONAL CERTIFICATION COMMISSION FOR ACUPUNCTURE AND ORIENTAL MEDICINE; or
- 2. [Determined] PASSING SCORE ON AN EXAMINATION THAT IS DETERMINED by the Board to be equivalent to the examination given by the [National Commission for the Certification of Acupuncturists] NATIONAL CERTIFICATION COMMISSION FOR ACUPUNCTURE AND ORIENTAL MEDICINE;
 - (4) Demonstrate the ability to communicate in the English language; and
 - (5) Meet any other qualifications that the Board establishes in regulations.".
