(2) THE PURPOSE OF THE FUND IS TO SUBSIDIZE THE DOCUMENTED
 COSTS OF PHYSICIAN UNCOMPENSATED CARE PROVIDED TO TRAUMA PATIENTS ON
 THE TRAUMA REGISTRY IN A TRAUMA CENTER DESIGNATED BY THE MARYLAND
 INSTITUTE FOR EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES SYSTEMS AS:

- (I) THE STATE PRIMARY ADULT RESOURCE CENTER;

25 (A) (1) EACH INSURER THAT OFFERS, SELLS, OR DELIVERS MOTOR VEHICLE
26 LIABILITY INSURANCE POLICIES IN THE STATE SHALL PAY ANNUALLY A FEE EQUAL
27 TO \$2 MULTIPLIED BY THE TOTAL NUMBER OF MOTOR VEHICLES REGISTERED IN
28 THE STATE INSURED BY THE CARRIER DURING THE YEAR.
