## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

## Vehicle Laws - Single Registration Plate

3 FOR the purpose of requiring the Motor Vehicle Administration to issue a single
4 registration plate to all classes of vehicles; providing for the method of 5 attachment of the registration plate; altering the number of vintage registration 6 plates that a person may display instead of a current registration plate; 7 requiring the publisher of the Annotated Code to make certain corrections;
8 making a stylistic change; making a technical change; and generally relating to 9 vehicle registration plates.

0 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article - Transportation Section 13-410, 13-411, and 13-936.1 Annotated Code of Maryland (2002 Replacement Volume)

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
6 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
Article - Transportation
8 13-410.
19 (a) (1) [Except as otherwise provided in this title, when] WHEN it registers 20 a vehicle, the Administration shall issue to the owner[:

21 (i) One] ONE registration plate [, if the vehicle is a Class D
22 (motorcycle) vehicle, Class F (tractor) vehicle, or Class G (trailer) vehicle; and
23 (ii) Two registration plates for every other vehicle].
4 (2) [However, as to temporary registration, the] THE Administration
25 may provide for the issuance of [only] one temporary registration plate for any
26 vehicle.
27 (b) (1) [Each] THE registration plate shall display:

(ii) The name of this State, which may be abbreviated.

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(2) The registration number may consist of letters, numerals, or both.
(c) (1) This [section] SUBSECTION applies only to the following vehicles:

29 (d) Registration plates may be reflectorized and shall be manufactured of a 30 material warranted to have a durability of at least 5 years. However, prior to
31 registration plates being reflectorized, the Administration shall obtain approval of the
32 General Assembly through a budget item.
33 (e) (1) During subsequent registration years, the Administrator may order 34 the continued use of registration plates that are valid during any current registration
35 year, and, after so doing, the Administrator shall issue, at the time a vehicle's

1 registration is renewed, a validation tab to evidence payment of the vehicle's annual
2 registration fee.
3 (2) The tab shall be displayed on the [plates] PLATE of the vehicle in the 4 manner that the Administrator requires.

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(3) The Administrator from time to time shall evaluate the condition of 6 registration plates issued under this title and may provide for the manufacture and 7 issuance of new registration plates. These new registration plates shall be issued and 8 subsequently validated in the manner required by this subtitle.

9 (f) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (c) of this section, the 10 Administration may issue reflectorized registration plates under §§ 13-618 and 11 13-619 of this title.

13 (a) [On a vehicle for which two registration plates are required, one plate 14 shall be attached on the front and the other on the rear of the vehicle.

15 (b) On a vehicle for which one registration plate is required, the] THE 16 REGISTRATION plate shall be attached on the:

17 (1) Front of the vehicle for a Class F (tractor) vehicle; and
18 (2) Rear of the vehicle for every other vehicle.
19 [(c)] (B) At all times, [each] THE registration plate shall be:
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(1) Maintained free from foreign materials, including registration plate 1 covers as defined in § 13-411.1 of this subtitle, and in a condition to be clearly legible; 2 and
(2) Securely fastened to the vehicle for which it is issued:
(i) In a horizontal position;
(ii) In a manner that prevents the plate from swinging; and
(iii) In a place and position to be clearly visible.
[(d)] (C) Except as otherwise expressly permitted by the Maryland Vehicle Law, as to any vehicle required to be registered under this title, a person may not drive the vehicle on any highway in this State, unless there is attached to the vehicle and displayed on it, as required in this title:
(1) A registration plate [or plates] issued for the vehicle by the

(2) Any validation tab issued for the vehicle under this subtitle.
$1 \quad[(\mathrm{e})] \quad$ (D) Except as otherwise expressly permitted by the Maryland Vehicle 2 Law, as to any vehicle required to be registered under this title, the owner of the 3 vehicle may not permit the vehicle to be driven on any highway in this State, unless 4 there is attached to and displayed on the vehicle, as required in this title:

5 (1) A registration plate [or plates] issued by the Administration for the 6 current registration period; and
(2) Any validation tab issued for the vehicle under this subtitle.
$8 \quad[(f)] \quad$ (E) $\quad$ Except as otherwise expressly permitted by the Maryland Vehicle 9 Law, a vehicle used or driven in this State may not display on either its front or rear 10 any expired registration plate issued by any state.
$11 \quad[(\mathrm{~g})] \quad$ (F) Except as otherwise expressly permitted by the Maryland Vehicle 12 Law, a person may not display or permit to be displayed on any vehicle used or driven 13 in this State any registration plate issued for another vehicle or to a person other 14 than the owner of the vehicle.
$15 \quad[(\mathrm{~h})] \quad(\mathrm{G}) \quad$ (1) A vehicle registered as a historic or antique vehicle (Class L) in 16 this State or in another state, when used or driven in this State, may display A 17 vintage registration [plates] PLATE as an indication of the historic or antique nature 18 of the vehicle. Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, the place on the 19 vehicle provided for the display of THE registration [plates] PLATE may only be used
20 for the display of THE current registration [plates] PLATE in accordance with
21 subsections (a) [through (c)] AND (B) of this section, and any vintage registration
22 plates which are used shall be displayed elsewhere on the vehicle.
(2) If the Administration authorizes the display of A vintage registration

24 [plates] PLATE in lieu of A current registration [plates] PLATE, as provided in §
25 13-936.1 of this title, the vintage registration [plates] PLATE shall be displayed as
26 required under subsections (a) [through (c)] AND (B) of this section. However, the
27 current registration [plates] PLATE shall be kept in the vehicle at all times.
$28 \quad[(\mathrm{i})] \quad$ (H) It is the duty of every police officer to report to the Administration all 29 vehicles operated in violation of this section. The Administration shall verify whether 30 the owner of a reported vehicle has complied with this section.

32 (a) In this section "vintage registration plate" means a Maryland registration
33 plate that was actually issued for display on a motor vehicle in a year not less than 25
34 years prior to January 1 of each calendar year.
35 (b) (1) Subject to the provisions of this subsection, the owner of a motor 36 vehicle registered under § 13-936 or § 13-937.1 of this subtitle as a Class L (historic)
37 or Class N (street rod) vehicle may display [2 vintage registration plates in lieu] A
38 VINTAGE REGISTRATION PLATE INSTEAD of A current registration [plates] PLATE on
39 that vehicle.

1 (2) The Administration may authorize the display of [2 vintage 2 registration plates in lieu] A VINTAGE REGISTRATION PLATE INSTEAD of A current
3 registration [plates] PLATE on a motor vehicle described in paragraph (1) of this
4 subsection if:

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(i) The owner of the motor vehicle submits an application on a form 6 prescribed by the Administrator;
(ii) The [2] vintage registration [plates were] PLATE WAS issued 8 in the same year as the model year of the motor vehicle; and
(iii) The owner of the motor vehicle pays a onetime registration fee 10 of \$13.50.

11 (c) If the Administration authorizes the display of A vintage registration
12 [plates] PLATE under this section:
13 (1) The vintage registration [plates] PLATE shall remain valid for as 14 long as title to the motor vehicle remains in the person who submitted an application 15 under subsection (b)(2)(i) of this section; and

16 (2) A fee in addition to the one time registration fee prescribed in 17 subsection (b)(2)(iii) of this section is not required for the issuance of the vintage 18 registration [plates] PLATE.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That any reference in the
20 Annotated Code of Maryland to multiple registration plates rendered obsolete by this
21 Act shall be corrected by the publisher of the Annotated Code, in consultation with
22 the Department of Legislative Services, with no further action required by the
23 General Assembly. The publisher shall adequately describe corrections made under
24 this section in the editor's note following the section affected.
25 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 26 October 1, 2003.
