- 26 [(d)] (E) The Secretary may enter on and inspect private property to
- 27 determine the presence, cause, and source of an infectious or contagious disease or

- 29 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED. That this Act shall take effect
- 30 July 1, 2004. It shall remain effective for a period of 10 years and, at the end of June
- 31 30, 2014, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be
- 32 abrogated and of no further force and effect.
