CHAPTER

1 AN ACT concerning

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Creation of a State Debt - Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2003, the Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loans of 1995, 1996, 1997, 1998, 1999, 2000, and 2002, and the General Construction Loans of 1988 and 1989

FOR the purpose of authorizing the creation of a State Debt in the amount of Seven 6 Hundred Twenty Two Million, Four Hundred Seventy Thousand Dollars 7 (\$722,470,000) Seven Hundred Forty-Two Million, Four Hundred Sixty-Nine 8 Thousand Dollars (\$742,469,000) the proceeds to be used for certain necessary 9 10 building. construction, demolition, planning, renovation, replacement, and capital equipment purchases of this State, for acquiring 11 certain real estate in connection therewith, and for grants to certain 12 subdivisions and other organizations for certain purposes, subject to the 13 requirement that certain grantees provide certain matching funds of a certain 14 type by a certain date; providing generally for the issuance and sale of bonds 15 evidencing the loan; providing for certain unexpended appropriations in prior 16 capital budgets and bond loan acts to be expended for other public projects; 17 altering certain requirements for certain programs in prior capital budget acts; 18 providing that the authorizations of State Debt in certain prior capital budgets 19 and bond loan acts be reduced by certain amounts; providing for certain 20 additional information to be detailed about each project in the capital program; 21 making a technical correction; and generally relating to the financing of certain 22 23 capital projects.

- 17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That: 18
- The Board of Public Works may borrow money and incur indebtedness on 19 behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as the Maryland 20 21 Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2003 in the total principal amount of \$722,470,000 \$742,469,000. This loan shall be evidenced by the issuance, sale, and delivery of State 22 23 general obligation bonds authorized by a resolution of the Board of Public Works and issued, sold, and delivered in accordance with Sections 8-117 through 8-124 of the 24 State Finance and Procurement Article and Article 31, Section 22 of the Code. 25
- 26 The bonds to evidence this loan or installments of this loan may be sold as a single issue of bonds under Section 8-122 of the State Finance and Procurement 27 Article. 28
- 29 The cash proceeds of the sale of the bonds shall be paid to the Treasurer and first shall be applied to the payment of the expenses of issuing, selling, and 30 delivering the bonds, unless funds for this purpose are otherwise provided, and then 31 shall be credited on the books of the Comptroller and expended, on approval by the 32 Board of Public Works, for the following public purposes, including any applicable 33 architects' and engineers' fees: 34

(4) An annual tax is imposed on all assessable property in the State in rate and amount sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds, as and when due and until paid in full. The principal shall be discharged within 15 years after the date of issue of the bonds.

(5) (a) Prior to the payment of any matching grant funds under the provisions of Section 1(3), Items ZA00 through ZB02 ZD01 above, grantees shall provide and expend matching funds as specified. No part of a grantee's matching fund may be provided, either directly or indirectly, from funds of the State, whether appropriated or unappropriated. Except as otherwise provided, no part of the fund may consist of real property, in–kind contributions, or funds expended prior to the effective date of this Act. In case of any dispute as to what money or assets may qualify as matching funds, the Board of Public Works shall determine the matter, and the Board's decision is final. Except as otherwise provided in this Act, grantees have until June 1, 2005, to present evidence satisfactory to the Board of Public Works that the matching fund will be provided. If satisfactory evidence is presented, the Board shall certify this fact to the State Treasurer and the proceeds of the loan shall be expended for the purposes provided in this Act.
