6 FOR the purpose of authorizing the creation of a State Debt in the amount of ~~Seven~~  
7 ~~Hundred Twenty Two Million, Four Hundred Seventy Thousand Dollars~~  
8 ~~(\$722,470,000)~~ Seven Hundred Forty-Two Million, Four Hundred Sixty-Nine  
9 Thousand Dollars (\$742,469,000) the proceeds to be used for certain necessary  
10 building, construction, demolition, planning, renovation, conversion,  
11 replacement, and capital equipment purchases of this State, for acquiring  
12 certain real estate in connection therewith, and for grants to certain  
13 subdivisions and other organizations for certain purposes, subject to the  
14 requirement that certain grantees provide certain matching funds of a certain  
15 type by a certain date; providing generally for the issuance and sale of bonds  
16 evidencing the loan; providing for certain unexpended appropriations in prior  
17 capital budgets and bond loan acts to be expended for other public projects;  
18 altering certain requirements for certain programs in prior capital budget acts;  
19 providing that the authorizations of State Debt in certain prior capital budgets  
20 and bond loan acts be reduced by certain amounts; providing for certain  
21 additional information to be detailed about each project in the capital program;  
22 making a technical correction; and generally relating to the financing of certain  
23 capital projects.

17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
18 MARYLAND, That:

19 (1) The Board of Public Works may borrow money and incur indebtedness on  
20 behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as the Maryland  
21 Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2003 in the total principal amount of ~~\$722,470,000~~  
22 \$742,469,000. This loan shall be evidenced by the issuance, sale, and delivery of State  
23 general obligation bonds authorized by a resolution of the Board of Public Works and  
24 issued, sold, and delivered in accordance with Sections 8-117 through 8-124 of the  
25 State Finance and Procurement Article and Article 31, Section 22 of the Code.

26 (2) The bonds to evidence this loan or installments of this loan may be sold as  
27 a single issue of bonds under Section 8-122 of the State Finance and Procurement  
28 Article.

29 (3) The cash proceeds of the sale of the bonds shall be paid to the Treasurer  
30 and first shall be applied to the payment of the expenses of issuing, selling, and  
31 delivering the bonds, unless funds for this purpose are otherwise provided, and then  
32 shall be credited on the books of the Comptroller and expended, on approval by the  
33 Board of Public Works, for the following public purposes, including any applicable

As the above listed projects are completed, the Department of General Services shall collect the actual cost data on the additional costs associated with incorporating green design and construction. Following the first and second years after construction is completed, for each project based on information derived from each project's measurement and verification program, the Department of General Services shall review: (1) the reported energy savings; (2) other savings attributable to the green building components of the project; and (3) whether incorporating green building components is beneficial for all types of projects.

SECTION ~~11~~ 13. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:

The Comptroller may advance funds from any loan fund account to any other loan fund account established pursuant to a general obligation bond loan enabling act, for any expenditure authorized by that act, provided that if general obligation bonds have not been issued under the authority of that act, the next ensuing sale of general obligation bonds shall include the issuance of bonds under the authority of that act in an amount at least equivalent to the amount of the funds so advanced.
