3 1 4 5 6 7 8 9 10 11	FOR the purpose of requiring an applicant for a cosmetology license to pass an examination consisting of written and practical parts; requiring the State Board of Cosmetologists to offer an examination consisting of written and practical parts; authorizing an applicant to take the written examination after completing a certain minimum number of hours of certain required training; requiring an applicant to pass the written examination before qualifying for the practical examination authorizing an applicant to take the written and practical parts of an examination during one administration of the examination; providing for a delayed effective date; and generally relating to examination requirements for the licensing of cosmetologists.

2 3	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
4	<b>Article - Business Occupations and Professions</b>

6 7	(a) (1) To qualify for a license to practice as a cosmetologist, an applicant shall be an individual who meets the requirements of this section.
8	(2) The applicant shall be at least 17 years old.
9 10	(3) The applicant shall have completed successfully a 9th grade education or the equivalent.
11 12	(4) (i) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, an applicant shall have received training by:
13 14	1. serving as a registered apprentice as provided under §§ 5-404 and 5-405(d) of this title; or
17	2. successfully completing a required program of at least 1,500 hours of training in a cosmetology school that is approved by the State Board of Education or the Maryland Higher Education Commission in consultation with the Board.
19 20	(ii) If an applicant is a barber or master barber currently licensed in this State, the Board shall:
21 22	1. credit the applicant with having met one-half of the training requirements of subparagraph (i) of this paragraph; and
23	2. determine the manner in which the credit will be applied.
24	(iii) An applicant meets the requirements of this subsection if:
	1. the applicant has held a cosmetologist license in another state or foreign country and has actively practiced cosmetology in the other state or foreign country for a period of 6 months; or
30 31	2. the applicant has been trained in a cosmetology school in another state or foreign country that has standards substantially equivalent to or more stringent than the standards of a school that is approved by the State Board of Education or the Maryland Higher Education Commission in consultation with the Board.

1 5-307. 2 Except as otherwise provided in § 5-307.1 of this subtitle, an applicant is (a) 3 entitled to be examined as provided in this section if the applicant: 4 (1) otherwise qualifies for a license under this title; and pays an examination fee, as established by the Board in accordance (2) 6 with §§ 5-205 and 5-306 of this title, to the Board or the Board's designee. The Board periodically shall give examinations to applicants at the times 7 and places that the Board determines. 8 9 (c) The Board shall give each qualified applicant notice of the time and place 10 of examination. 11 (d) (1) [The] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (2) OF THIS SECTION, 12 THE Board shall determine the subjects, scope, and form of and the passing score for examinations given under this subtitle. 14 (2)(I) An examination [may] SHALL consist of written and practical 15 parts. AN APPLICANT MAY TAKE A WRITTEN EXAMINATION WHEN 16 (II)17 THE APPLICANT HAS COMPLETED AT LEAST 1,380 HOURS OF THE 1,500 HOURS OF 18 TRAINING IN A COSMETOLOGY SCHOOL REQUIRED UNDER § 5-304(A)(4)(<del>2)</del>2 OF THIS 19 SUBTITLE. AN APPLICANT IS REQUIRED TO PASS THE WRITTEN 20 (III) 21 EXAMINATION BEFORE THE APPLICANT IS QUALIFIED TO TAKE THE PRACTICAL WHO 22 HAS COMPLETED 1,500 HOURS OF TRAINING AS SPECIFIED IN SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF 23 THIS PARAGRAPH MAY TAKE THE WRITTEN AND PRACTICAL PARTS OF AN 24 EXAMINATION DURING ONE ADMINISTRATION OF THE EXAMINATION. The Board or the Board's designee shall mail to each applicant notice of the 26 applicant's examination result.
