21 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 22 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

1 **Article - Correctional Services** 2 11-901. In this subtitle, "fund" means an inmate welfare fund established under § 4 11-902 of this subtitle. 5 11-902. Each local correctional facility may establish an inmate welfare fund. 6 (a) 7 A fund may be used only for goods and services that benefit the general (b) 8 inmate population as defined by regulations that the managing official of the local 9 correctional facility adopts. 10 11-903. 11 (a) Each fund is a special continuing, nonlapsing fund. (1) 12 (2) Each fund consists of: (i) profits derived from the sale of goods through the 13 1. commissary operation and telephone and vending machine commissions; and 15 2. subject to subparagraph (ii) of this paragraph, money 16 received from other sources. 17 Money from the General Fund of the State or county, including (ii) 18 any federal funds, may not be transferred by budget amendment or otherwise to a 19 fund. 20 (I) [The] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF THIS 21 PARAGRAPH, THE chief financial officer for a county shall separately hold and shall 22 account for each fund in the county. 23 (II)THE CHIEF FINANCIAL OFFICER FOR DORCHESTER COUNTY OR 24 THE MANAGING OFFICIAL OF THE LOCAL CORRECTIONAL FACILITY AS DESIGNATED 25 BY DORCHESTER COUNTY SHALL SEPARATELY HOLD AND SHALL ACCOUNT FOR 26 EACH FUND IN DORCHESTER COUNTY.
