A BILL ENTITLED

Elections - Study Commission on the Redistricting Process in Maryland

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- 3 FOR the purpose of establishing a Study Commission on the Redistricting Process in 4 Maryland; specifying the composition, powers, and duties of the Commission;
- 5 providing for the staffing of the Commission; requiring the Commission to
- 6 report its findings and recommendations, including suggested constitutional
- and legislative changes, to the Governor and the General Assembly by a certain
- 8 date; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the
- 9 Study Commission on the Redistricting Process.
- 10 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 11 MARYLAND, That:

1 AN ACT concerning

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- 12 (a) There is a Study Commission on the Redistricting Process in Maryland.
- 13 (b) The Commission shall consist of the following 13 members:
- 14 (1) Two members of the Senate of Maryland, one of whom shall be a
- 15 member of the minority party, appointed by the President of the Senate;
- 16 (2) Two members of the House of Delegates of Maryland, one of whom
- 17 shall be a member of the minority party appointed by the Speaker of the House;
- 18 (3) Seven individuals appointed by the Governor, including:
- 19 (i) A representative of the League of Women Voters of Maryland;
- 20 (ii) A representative of the Center for Voting and Democracy, a
- 21 Maryland organization;
- 22 (iii) A representative of the Maryland Institute for Policy Analysis
- 23 and Research at the University of Maryland Baltimore County; and
- 24 (iv) Four other individuals, chosen from among individuals and
- 25 organizations who have demonstrated strong civic and community involvement and
- 26 participation in the electoral process; and

- 1 (4) Two members of the general public, appointed jointly by the 2 President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House.
- 3 (c) The Governor shall designate the chairman of the Commission.
- 4 (d) The Department of Legislative Services and the State Board of Elections 5 shall provide staff for the Commission.
- 6 (e) The Commission shall:
- 7 (1) Examine the current redistricting process in Maryland as it relates to
- 8 the redistricting of the General Assembly and the State's representatives to the
- 9 United States Congress following each decennial census;
- 10 (2) Collect and analyze information relating to the manner and methods
- 11 utilized for state legislative and United States congressional redistricting in other
- 12 states around the country following each decennial census;
- 13 (3) As it considers appropriate, receive testimony from and consult with
- 14 individuals who are knowledgeable about State and federal constitutional and
- 15 statutory requirements and other matters related to the redistricting process; and
- 16 (4) Suggest any State constitutional or statutory changes that it
- 17 concludes are desirable in order to improve the redistricting process in Maryland.
- 18 (f) On or before December 31, 2004, the Commission shall report its findings
- 19 and recommendations, including any proposed changes to the Constitution of
- 20 Maryland or any statutory changes to the Maryland election law, to the Governor,
- 21 and, subject to § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, to the General Assembly for
- 22 consideration by the General Assembly in the 2005 Session.
- 23 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 24 July 1, 2003. It shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and, at the end of June
- 25 30, 2005, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be
- 26 abrogated and of no further force and effect.
