Crimes - Counterfeiting United States Currency

3 FOR the purpose of making it unlawful to manufacture with intent to defraud,

4 counterfeit, cause to be counterfeited, or willingly aid or assist in counterfeiting

5 United States currency; making it unlawful to make, transmit, or have control of

6 certain types of images of United States currency with intent to defraud;

7 providing criminal penalties for a violation of this Act prohibiting a person, with

8 intent to defraud, from manufacturing, counterfeiting, or causing, aiding, or

9 assisting in counterfeiting United States currency; prohibiting a person, with

10 intent to defraud, from making, scanning, recording, reproducing, transmitting,

11 or possessing certain images of United States currency; establishing certain

12 penalties; providing that the District Court has jurisdiction that is concurrent

13 with a circuit court in certain criminal cases involving the counterfeiting of

5 (3) MAKE, SCAN, RECORD, REPRODUCE, TRANSMIT, OR HAVE IN THE
6 PERSON'S CONTROL, CUSTODY, OR POSSESSION AN ANALOG, DIGITAL, OR
7 ELECTRONIC IMAGE OF UNITED STATES CURRENCY WITH INTENT TO DEFRAUD.

12 (a) A person may not knowingly possess, with unlawful intent, or issue 13 counterfeit United States currency.

14 (b) A person who violates this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and on 15 conviction is subject to imprisonment not exceeding 3 years or a fine not exceeding 16 \$1,000 or both.
