12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

14 **Article - Health - General**

15 15-603.

16 (a) The Plan provided under this subtitle shall:

17 (1) Subject to the moneys available in the Fund, provide benefits to [not  
18 more than 30,000 enrollees at any one time] THE MAXIMUM NUMBER OF  
19 INDIVIDUALS ELIGIBLE FOR ENROLLMENT IN THE PROGRAM;

20 (2) Set the monthly premium charged an enrollee at \$10;

21 (3) Not require a deductible; and

22 (4) Limit the co-pay charged an enrollee to:

23 (i) \$10 for a prescription for a generic drug;

1 (ii) \$20 for a prescription for a preferred brand name drug; and

2 (iii) \$35 for a prescription for a nonpreferred brand name drug.

3 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency  
4 measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety,  
5 has been passed by a ye and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members  
6 elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from  
7 the date it is enacted.
