1 AN ACT concerning
2 Garrett County - Animal Control - Civil and Criminal Penalties
FOR the purpose of establishing that the County Commissioners of Garrett County may impose civil penalties for violations of certain animal control ordinances in Garrett County; authorizing the County Commissioners in Garrett County to provide for the prosecution of a violation of certain animal control ordinances in a certain manner and to a certain extent; providing that a certain criminal penalty does not apply in Garrett County; and generally relating to civil and criminal penalties for violations of certain animal control ordinances in Garrett County.  BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,
Article 24 - Political Subdivisions - Miscellaneous Provisions Section 11-504(o) and 11-509 Annotated Code of Maryland (2001 Replacement Volume and 2002 Supplement)
SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
Article 24 - Political Subdivisions - Miscellaneous Provisions
19 11-504.
(0) (1) In addition to and not in substitution for any powers granted under this subtitle, the county commissioners of Dorchester, Garrett, and Somerset counties may by ordinance provide for a comprehensive system for the regulation of dogs and

- 1 cats within the county, including licensing and control. These regulations may include
- 2 provision for the impounding and disposal of unlicensed or dangerous dogs and cats
- 3 and penalties, including in Dorchester County AND GARRETT COUNTY civil or
- 4 criminal penalties, for violations of any of the provisions of the regulations.
- 5 (2) In Dorchester County AND GARRETT COUNTY, the County
- 6 Commissioners may provide that a violation of a county dog or cat control ordinance
- 7 shall be prosecuted by the county in the same manner and to the same extent as
- 8 provided for municipal infractions under Article 23A, § 3(b) of the Code.

- 10 (a) Any person violating or refusing to comply with any of the provisions of
- 11 this subtitle is guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be fined not less than \$5 nor more
- 12 than \$25 or shall be imprisoned in the county jail for not more than 30 days, or shall
- 13 be both fined and imprisoned. The State's Attorney and the sheriffs of the several
- 14 counties shall prosecute all persons found violating the law by refusing to comply with
- 15 its provisions.
- 16 (b) In Calvert County the fine is \$50 or 60 days.
- 17 (c) This subtitle does not apply to the City of Baltimore, the City of
- 18 Cambridge, or the City of Crisfield.
- 19 (d) This section does not apply in Washington County.
- 20 (e) THIS SECTION DOES NOT APPLY IN GARRETT COUNTY.
- 21 (F) This section does not apply to a violation of § 11-512, § 11-513, or § 11-514
- 22 of this subtitle.
