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## Higher Education - Resident Tuition Charges - Immigrant Students

3 FOR the purpose of establishing that certain individuals, other than certain

- 4 nonresident aliens, shall be exempt from paying nonresident tuition at certain
- 5 public institutions of higher education under certain circumstances; prohibiting
- 6 certain institutions of higher education from awarding degrees to certain
- 7 individuals under certain circumstances; requiring the Maryland Higher
- 8 Education Commission to adopt certain regulations; and generally relating to
- 9 tuition charges for certain individuals attending public institutions of higher
- 10 education in the State.

- 16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## **Article - Education**

3 (A) NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISION OF THIS ARTICLE, AN
4 INDIVIDUAL OTHER THAN A NONIMMIGRANT ALIEN WITHIN THE MEANING OF TITLE
5 8, § 1101(A)(15) OF THE UNITED STATES CODE, SHALL BE EXEMPT FROM PAYING
6 NONRESIDENT TUITION AT A PUBLIC INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION IF THE
7 INDIVIDUAL:

8 (1) ATTENDED A PUBLIC OR PRIVATE SECONDARY SCHOOL IN THIS 9 STATE FOR AT LEAST 3 YEARS;

10 (2) GRADUATED FROM A PUBLIC OR PRIVATE SECONDARY SCHOOL IN 11 THIS STATE OR RECEIVED THE EQUIVALENT OF A HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA IN THIS 12 STATE;

13 (3) REGISTERS AS AN ENTERING STUDENT IN A PUBLIC INSTITUTION OF 14 HIGHER EDUCATION IN THIS STATE NOT EARLIER THAN THE 2003 FALL SEMESTER;

(4) PROVIDES TO THE PUBLIC INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION AN
 AFFIDAVIT STATING THAT THE INDIVIDUAL WILL FILE AN APPLICATION TO BECOME
 A PERMANENT RESIDENT WITHIN 30 DAYS AFTER THE INDIVIDUAL BECOMES
 ELIGIBLE TO DO SO; AND

(5) MAKES APPLICATION TO ATTEND A PUBLIC INSTITUTION OF HIGHER
 EDUCATION IN THIS STATE NOT LATER THAN 5 YEARS AFTER GRADUATING FROM A
 PUBLIC OR PRIVATE SECONDARY SCHOOL IN THIS STATE OR RECEIVING THE
 EQUIVALENT OF A HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA IN THIS STATE.

23 (B) <u>A PUBLIC INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION MAY NOT AWARD A</u>
 24 <u>DEGREE TO AN INDIVIDUAL WHO QUALIFIES FOR RESIDENT TUITION CHARGES</u>
 25 <u>UNDER THIS SECTION UNTIL:</u>

26(1)THE INDIVIDUAL FILES THE AFFIDAVIT SPECIFIED UNDER THIS27SECTION; OR

28 (2) PAYS THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN THE TUITION CHARGES FOR A
 29 NONRESIDENT STUDENT AND THE TUITION CHARGES FOR A RESIDENT STUDENT AT
 30 THE INSTITUTION.

31 (C) <u>THE COMMISSION SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS IN ACCORDANCE WITH</u>
 32 <u>TITLE 10, SUBTITLE 1 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE TO IMPLEMENT THE</u>
 33 <u>PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION.</u>
