A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Oral Health Programs - Reducing Oral Cancer Mortality**

3 FOR the purpose of requiring the Secretary of Health and Mental Hygiene to
4 establish the Oral Health Program to prevent and detect oral cancer in the State
5 with a certain focus and intent; targeting the Program to the needs of high-risk
6 underserved populations; requiring the Secretary, in consultation with certain
7 providers, to develop and implement certain programs to train health care
8 providers to screen and refer patients with oral cancers and to promote certain
9 smoking cessation programs; requiring the Secretary to evaluate the Program
10 and to submit certain reports annually to the Governor and the General
11 Assembly; requiring the Oral Health Advisory Committee to make certain
12 recommendations; providing for the funding of certain programs established
13 under the provisions of this Act; and generally relating to the Oral Health
14 Program.

21 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
22 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

23 **Article - Health - General**

24 **SUBTITLE 10. ORAL HEALTH PROGRAM.**

26 THE SECRETARY SHALL ESTABLISH AND PROMOTE THE ORAL HEALTH
27 PROGRAM TO PREVENT AND DETECT ORAL CANCER IN THE STATE, WITH A PRIMARY

1 FOCUS OF MEETING THE NEEDS OF HIGH-RISK UNDERSERVED POPULATIONS, WITH
2 THE INTENT TO REDUCE ORAL CANCER MORTALITY.

3 18-1002.

4 (A) IN CONSULTATION WITH DENTAL CARE PROVIDERS, THE SECRETARY
5 SHALL DEVELOP AND IMPLEMENT ONGOING ORAL CANCER EDUCATIONAL
6 PROGRAMS IN THE STATE:

7 (1) TO TRAIN HEALTH CARE PROVIDERS TO SCREEN AND PROPERLY
8 REFER PATIENTS WITH ORAL CANCERS; AND

9 (2) TO PROMOTE SMOKING CESSATION WITH A PRIMARY FOCUS OF
10 MEETING THE NEEDS OF HIGH-RISK UNDERSERVED POPULATIONS.

11 (B) THE PROGRAMS DEVELOPED AND IMPLEMENTED UNDER SUBSECTION (A)
12 OF THIS SECTION SHALL ADDRESS:

13 (1) THE RISK FACTORS THAT LEAD TO ORAL CANCER;

14 (2) THE SIGNS AND SYMPTOMS OF ORAL CANCER;

15 (3) THE HIGH-RISK BEHAVIORS THAT MAY LEAD TO ORAL CANCER; AND

16 (4) THE ACCESSIBILITY OF SCREENING TO DETECT ORAL CANCER.

18 ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 1 OF EACH YEAR, THE SECRETARY SHALL SUBMIT A
19 REPORT ON ITS FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE GOVERNOR AND,
20 SUBJECT TO § 2-1246 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE GENERAL
21 ASSEMBLY ON THE ORAL HEALTH PROGRAMS ESTABLISHED UNDER THIS SUBTITLE.

22 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That any programs
23 established under the provisions of this Act shall be funded as provided for in the
24 State budget.

25 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the existing Oral
26 Health Advisory Committee appointed by the Secretary shall recommend to the
27 Secretary the best methods to promote and implement a strategy to decrease oral
28 cancer mortality and to implement the provisions of this Act.

29 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take
30 effect October 1, 2003.
