2 Crimes - Controlled Dangerous Substances - Penalties for 3, 3 4-methylenedioxymethamphetamine (MDMA)

- 4 FOR the purpose of clarifying that certain crimes relating to controlled dangerous
- 5 substances apply to any amount of 3, 4-methylenedioxymethamphetamine
- 6 (MDMA); making this Act an emergency measure; and generally relating to

- 13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 15 Article Criminal Law
- 16 5-609.
- 17 (a) Except as otherwise provided in this section, a person who violates a
- 18 provision of §§ 5-602 through 5-606 of this subtitle with respect to any of the
- 19 following controlled dangerous substances is guilty of a felony and on conviction is
- 20 subject to imprisonment not exceeding 20 years or a fine not exceeding \$20,000 or
- 21 both:
- 22 (9) [750 grams or more of] 3, 4-methylenedioxymethamphetamine
- 23 (MDMA).
- 24 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an
- 25 emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health
- 26 or safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all of the
- 27 members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take
- 28 effect from the date it is enacted.
