3 FOR the purpose of altering the definition of "gifted and talented student" for the

4 purpose of certain public school programs; specifying certain findings made by

5 the General Assembly; requiring the State Board of Education to require county

6 boards of education to develop and implement certain procedures and services

7 for gifted and talented students that meet certain standards; requiring that

8 certain funds be included in the State budget as part of the State aid to

9 education; making a stylistic change; and generally relating to educational

10 services and programs for gifted and talented students.

16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

20 In this [subtitle] SUBTITLE, "gifted and talented student" means an elementary

21 or secondary student who is identified by professionally qualified individuals as

 7 STATE BOARD.

8 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 9 October 1, 2003.
