- 15 [(a)] Unless it fails to meet the applicable school bus and motor vehicle safety
- 16 standards, a conventional school bus may be operated for [12] 15 years.
- 17 [(b) Notwithstanding the 12-year limitation in subsection (a) of this section, a
- 18 conventional school bus may be operated for additional years if:
- 19 (1) The bus is maintained under a preventive maintenance plan
- 20 approved by the Motor Vehicle Administration and the Automotive Safety
- 21 Enforcement Division of the Department of State Police that includes an inspection at
- 22 the end of the 12th year and a minimum of 2 inspections by the Motor Vehicle
- 23 Administration each year thereafter;
- 24 (2) Any structural repairs to the bus necessitated by accident, metal
- 25 fatigue, or any other cause are certified by an independent expert approved by the
- 26 Motor Vehicle Administration to meet or exceed the manufacturer's original
