A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Prince George's County - Class B-ECF/DS Beer, Wine and Liquor License -**
3 **Annual Fee**
4 **PG 301-03**

5 FOR the purpose of altering the annual license fee for the Prince George's County
6 Class B-Education Conference Facility/Dining Service (ECF/DS) beer, wine and
7 liquor license; and generally relating to the Prince George's County Class
8 B-ECF/DS beer, wine and liquor license.

19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
20 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

21 **Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages**

22 6-201.

23 (r) (1) (i) This subsection applies only in Prince George's County.

24 (12) (i) There is a Class B-ECF/DS license.

25 (ii) The annual license fee is [\$4,400] \$6,750.

1 (iii) The Board may issue a special Class B beer, wine and liquor
2 (on-sale) license known as a Class B-Education Conference Facility/Dining Service
3 license (Class B-ECF/DS license).

4 (iv) A Class B-ECF/DS license may only be issued to an individual
5 who is:

6 1. Authorized by the University of Maryland, College Park to
7 act on its behalf under this license and be subject to the conditions, restrictions, and
8 penalties under this article; and

9 2. A resident and registered voter of Prince George's County.

10 (v) The residency requirement under § 9-101 of this article does
11 not apply to a license applicant under this paragraph.

12 (vi) A Class B-ECF/DS license authorizes the holder to sell beer,
13 wine, and liquor from multiple designated outlets on the University's campus only at
14 University-related functions catered by the Department of Dining Services.

15 (vii) 1. A Class B-ECF/DS license is restricted to on-sale
16 privileges only.

17 2. Any alcoholic beverages purchased at a designated outlet
18 shall be consumed within the confines of that outlet and may not be transported to
19 another outlet.

20 (viii) All profits from the retail sale of alcoholic beverages under this
21 paragraph shall be deposited in the Dining Services Income Fund of the University of
22 Maryland.

23 (ix) The Board:

24 1. May regulate the manner in which alcoholic beverages are
25 dispensed under a Class B-ECF/DS license;

26 2. Prior to the issuance of this license, shall designate the
27 exact campus locations for the outlets for the sale of alcoholic beverages under this
28 license;

29 3. Shall maintain a map and description of the designated
30 outlets for verification upon the renewal of this license;

31 4. Shall require the Department of Dining Services of the
32 University of Maryland, College Park to report to the Board at least 5 days in advance
33 of all University-related catered functions at which beer, wine, or liquor is intended
34 to be sold or served; and

35 5. Shall process this license in the same manner as any other
36 license issued by the Board.

1 (x) The hours and days of sale under this license are as provided
2 under § 11-517 of this article.

3 (xi) The restriction on the distance between the location of a school
4 and an alcoholic beverages licensed premises does not apply to a Class B-ECF/DS
5 license.

6 (xii) The general prohibition on the number of alcoholic beverages
7 licenses for the same person or premises does not apply to a Class B-ECF/DS license.

8 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take
9 effect October 1, 2003.
