

3	(4) The Board may revoke or suspend a license, whether new or by transfer, when the license has not been placed in operation after a period of six months from the date of the approval by the Board of the new license or transfer of license.
5 6	(5) In addition to the above, the Board may revoke the license of a licensee for:
7 8	(i) A felony conviction of a licensee or any stockholder of a corporation having the use of an alcoholic beverages license; or
	(ii) Closing the licensed premises for more than 30 days without the Board's permission. The Board may allow a closing of the licensed premises for a reasonable period of time.
14	(6) If a sole proprietorship, partnership, corporation, club, or association has not complied with the residency requirements as specified in § 9-101 of this article, the Board of License Commissioners may revoke or suspend the license of a licensee.
18	(7) The Board may revoke, suspend, or refuse to renew the license of a licensee, or refuse to issue a license to an applicant, if the licensee or applicant willfully failed or refused to pay hotel/motel taxes due and owed to the county within 60 days after the licensee or applicant received the first notice of delinquency.

23 24	(r) In Prince George's County the Board of License Commissioners may impose a fine [of not more than \$5,000 in lieu of ] NOT EXCEEDING \$12,500 INSTEAD OF or in addition to suspension or revocation of a license for any violation that is cause for suspension or revocation under the alcoholic beverage laws affecting Prince George's County.
