A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **A Task Force to Study the Dearth of African American Owned Automobile**
3 **Dealerships in Maryland**

4 FOR the purpose of establishing a Task Force to Study the Dearth of African
5 American Owned Automobile Dealerships in Maryland; providing for a certain
6 membership of the Task Force; specifying the duties of the Task Force; providing
7 a certain staff for the Task Force; requiring the Task Force to report to the
8 Governor and the General Assembly on or before a certain date; prohibiting
9 certain persons from the receipt of certain compensation, and authorizing the
10 reimbursement of certain expenses; providing for the termination of this Act;
11 and generally relating to the Task Force to Study the Dearth of African
12 American Owned Automobile Dealerships in Maryland.

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
14 MARYLAND, That:

15 (a) There is a Task Force to Study the Dearth of African American Owned
16 Automobile Dealerships in Maryland.

17 (b) The Task Force consists of the following members:

18 (1) two members of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by the President
19 of the Senate as follows:

20 (i) one member from the Senate Finance Committee; and

21 (ii) one member from the Senate Judicial Proceedings Committee;

22 (2) three members of the House of Delegates, appointed by the Speaker
23 of the House as follows:

24 (i) one member from the House Appropriations Committee;

25 (ii) one member from the House Economic Matters Committee; and

26 (iii) one member from the House Judiciary Committee;

1 (3) the Secretary of Business and Economic Development or the
2 Secretary's designee;

3 (4) two representatives from the automobile manufacturing industry,
4 appointed by the Governor;

5 (5) two representatives from the automobile dealership industry,
6 appointed by the Governor;

7 (6) two representatives from the banking industry, appointed by the
8 Governor; and

9 (7) two members of the general public, appointed by the Governor.

10 (c) The Governor shall designate the chairman of the Task Force.

11 (d) The Department of Business and Economic Development shall provide
12 staff for the Task Force.

13 (e) A member of the Task Force:

14 (1) may not receive compensation; but

15 (2) is entitled to reimbursement for expenses under the Standard State
16 Travel Regulations, as provided in the State budget.

17 (f) The Task Force shall:

18 (1) study the automobile industry in the State to determine why there
19 are so few African American owned dealerships in the State;

20 (2) determine the number of African American owned automobile
21 dealerships in the State;

22 (3) compile statistics of the number of African American owned
23 automobile dealerships to the number of African Americans who purchase
24 automobiles; and

25 (4) make recommendations on methods to increase the number of
26 African American owned dealerships in the State.

27 (g) The Task Force shall report its findings and recommendations to the
28 Governor and, subject to § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, the General
29 Assembly on or before December 1, 2005.

30 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
31 October 1, 2003. It shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and 3 months, and, at
32 the end of December 31, 2005, with no further action required by the General
33 Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
