HOUSE BILL 521

1 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

2 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

5 (A) A LICENSED <u>OR CERTIFIED</u> REAL ESTATE APPRAISER SHALL FILE WITH
6 THE COMMISSION <u>OR A DESIGNEE OTHERWISE PROVIDED BY LAW</u> AT THE END OF
7 EVERY CALENDAR QUARTER A REPORT LISTING THE ADDRESS AND APPRAISED
8 VALUE OF <u>RESIDENTIAL</u> REAL ESTATE <u>IN BALTIMORE CITY</u> UPON WHICH THE
9 <u>LICENSEE APPRAISER</u> PERFORMED AN APPRAISAL DURING THE CALENDAR
10 QUARTER.

(B) THE REPORT SHALL BE OPEN FOR INSPECTION <u>ONLY</u> TO
 REPRESENTATIVES OF GOVERNMENT AGENCIES FOR INVESTIGATION OF
 FRAUDULENT PRACTICES.

14 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That it is the intent of the

15 General Assembly that funding be provided in the State budget for an investigator, an

16 administrative assistant, and any necessary increase in computer capacity to

17 accommodate the quarterly reporting requirements. .

18 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Baltimore City

19 Department of Housing and Community Development shall serve as the designee of the

20 State Commission of Real Estate Appraisers and Home Inspectors and shall receive

21 and maintain the reports filed under § 16-212.1 of the Business Occupations and

22 Professions Article as enacted by Section 1 of this Act until such time as funding is

23 made available to the Commission to establish an electronic database capable of

24 storing the reports and to hire staff to maintain the database.
