FOR the purpose of exempting certain outside surfaces of residential rental property from certain lead paint risk reduction standards if the owner submits to the Department of the Environment a certain inspection report that indicates that the outside surfaces have been tested and are lead-free; and generally relating to exempting lead-free outside surfaces of residential rental property from certain lead paint risk reduction standards.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

18 (a) Affected property is exempt from the provisions of Part IV of this subtitle 19 if the owner submits to the Department an inspection report that:
20 (1) Indicates that the affected property has been tested for the presence 21 of lead-based paint in accordance with standards and procedures established by the 22 Department by regulation;

1 (2) States that: 2 (i) All interior surfaces of the affected property are lead-free; 3 All exterior painted surfaces of the affected property that were (ii) 4 chipping, peeling, or flaking have been restored with nonlead-based paint; and 5 (iii) No exterior painted surfaces of the affected property are 6 chipping, peeling, or flaking; and Is verified by the Department accredited inspector who performed 7 (3) 8 the test. 9 (b) In order to maintain exemption UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION 10 from the provisions of Part IV of this subtitle, the owner shall submit to the 11 Department every 2 years a certification, by a Department accredited inspector, 12 stating that no exterior painted surface of the affected property is chipping, peeling, 13 or flaking. 14 (C) OUTSIDE SURFACES OF AN AFFECTED PROPERTY, INCLUDING WINDOWS, 15 DOORS, TRIM, FENCES, PORCHES, AND OTHER BUILDINGS OR STRUCTURES THAT ARE 16 PART OF THE AFFECTED PROPERTY, ARE EXEMPT FROM THE RISK REDUCTION 17 STANDARDS UNDER §§ 6-815 AND 6-819 OF THIS SUBTITLE IF THE OWNER SUBMITS TO THE DEPARTMENT AN INSPECTION REPORT THAT: 19 INDICATES THAT THE OUTSIDE SURFACES HAVE BEEN TESTED FOR (1)20 THE PRESENCE OF LEAD-BASED PAINT IN ACCORDANCE WITH STANDARDS AND 21 PROCEDURES ESTABLISHED BY THE DEPARTMENT BY REGULATION; STATES THAT ALL OUTSIDE SURFACES OF THE AFFECTED PROPERTY 22 (2) 23 ARE LEAD-FREE; AND 24 IS VERIFIED BY THE DEPARTMENT ACCREDITED INSPECTOR WHO (3) 25 PERFORMED THE TEST.
