A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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State Retirement and Pension System - Board of Trustees - Membership

3 FOR the purpose of adding an additional teacher trustee to the Board of Trustees for

4 the State Retirement and Pension System; requiring that one of the trustees be

5 a retiree of either the Teachers' Retirement System or Teachers' Pension System

6 at the time of the trustee's election to the Board; requiring the Board to take

7 certain actions to implement this Act; and generally relating to the membership

8 of the Board of Trustees for the State Retirement and Pension System.

14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Board of Trustees for
the State Retirement and Pension System shall schedule the election of the new
trustee as soon as possible. In order to meet the member-to-retiree ratio described in
Section 1 of this Act, the new trustee should be either a retiree or a member of the
Teachers' Pension System or the Teachers' Retirement System, depending on the
Board's membership at the time of the election.
