A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Natural Resources - Black Bear Hunt - Moratorium

3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting the Department of Natural Resources from

- 4 establishing an open season to hunt black bears until a certain date; prohibiting
- 5 the Department from reducing the black bear population in the State, subject to
- 6 a certain exception, until a certain date; prohibiting a person in certain counties
- 7 from hunting black bears until the Department establishes an open season to
- 8 hunt black bears; classifying black bears as nongame mammals until a certain
- 9 date; requiring the Department to conduct a certain survey and report the
- 10 findings to the Governor and certain committees of the General Assembly on or
- 11 before a certain date; providing for a delayed effective date for certain provisions

12 of this Act; altering a certain definition; and generally relating to a moratorium

13 on an open season to hunt black bears.

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1 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 2 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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Article - Natural Resources

5 (a) In this title the following words have the meanings indicated.

6 (f) "Forest game birds and mammals" means forest game birds (ruffed grouse 7 and turkey) and forest game mammals ([black bears,] deer, fox squirrels, excluding 8 the Delmarva subspecies, and gray and red squirrels) or any part, egg, offspring, or 9 dead body of any of them.

10 (i) "Game birds or mammals" means the species defined as forest game birds 11 and mammals, fur-bearing mammals, upland game birds and mammals, and wetland 12 game birds or any part, egg, offspring, or dead body of any of them.

(n) "Nongame birds and mammals" means every wild mammal and bird not
classified as game birds and mammals or any part, egg, offspring, or dead body of any
of them.

16 (o) (1) "Open season" means the time when a person lawfully may hunt 17 game birds and mammals.

18 (2) "Open season" includes both the first and last day of the season or 19 period designated by this title.

21 (A) (1) [The] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS

22 SUBSECTION, THE Department may reduce the wildlife population in any county,

23 election district, or other identifiable area of the State after a thorough investigation

24 reveals that protected wildlife is seriously injurious to agricultural or other interests

25 in the affected area.

(2) (I) SUBJECT TO SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF THIS PARAGRAPH, THE
DEPARTMENT MAY NOT REDUCE THE BLACK BEAR POPULATION IN ANY AREA OF
THE STATE UNTIL ON OR AFTER JULY 1, 2009.

29 (II) UNTIL JULY 1, 2009, THE DEPARTMENT MAY KILL A BLACK BEAR 30 ONLY:

I. IN DEFENSE OF A PERSON, THE PROPERTY OF A PERSON,
 OR DOMESTICATED ANIMALS ON THE PROPERTY OF A PERSON; AND

33 2. AFTER EXHAUSTING ALL NONLETHAL METHODS OF
34 RESOLVING PROBLEMS CAUSED BY THE BLACK BEAR.

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1 (B) The method of reducing the wildlife population is at the Department's 2 discretion, except that trapping is preferred whenever feasible.

3 (C) The Department shall dispose of wildlife taken pursuant to the provisions 4 of this section as the Department deems advisable.

6 (a) (1) To provide a fund to pay the expense of protecting and managing 7 wildlife, and preventing unauthorized persons from hunting them, a person may not 8 hunt or attempt to hunt during open season and in any permitted manner any game 9 birds and mammals in the State without first having procured either a resident or 10 nonresident hunter's license. [A person may not hunt or attempt to hunt nongame 11 birds and mammals in Baltimore County or Frederick County without first obtaining 12 a license. A permanent resident of a government reservation may obtain a resident

13 hunter's license.]

14(2)A PERMANENT RESIDENT OF A GOVERNMENT RESERVATION MAY15OBTAIN A RESIDENT HUNTER'S LICENSE.

16(3)(I)SUBJECT TO SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF THIS PARAGRAPH, A17PERSON MAY NOT HUNT OR ATTEMPT TO HUNT NONGAME BIRDS AND MAMMALS IN18BALTIMORE COUNTY OR FREDERICK COUNTY WITHOUT FIRST OBTAINING A19LICENSE.

20 (II) A PERSON MAY NOT HUNT BLACK BEARS IN BALTIMORE
21 COUNTY OR FREDERICK COUNTY UNTIL THE DEPARTMENT ESTABLISHES AN OPEN
22 SEASON UNDER § 10-405(A)(2) OF THIS TITLE.

24 (a) (1) Pursuant to § 10-205 of this title, AND SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPH (2)

25 OF THIS SUBSECTION, the Department shall establish by regulation and publish by

26 July 1 each year the open season, excepting Sundays, to hunt the forest and upland 27 game birds and mammals.

28 (2) THE DEPARTMENT MAY NOT ESTABLISH AN OPEN SEASON TO HUNT 29 BLACK BEARS UNTIL ON OR AFTER JULY 1, 2009.

30 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Laws of Maryland 31 read as follows:

3 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That on July 1, 2008, the

4 Department of Natural Resources shall commence a survey of the black bear

5 population in Maryland using the most effective science and technology available at

6 that time. The Department shall report the findings of its survey to the Governor and,

7 in accordance with § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, to the House

8 Environmental Matters Committee and the Senate Education, Health, and

9 Environmental Affairs Committee on or before December 1, 2008.

10 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Section 2 of this Act shall 11 take effect July 1, 2009.

12 SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, except as provided in

13 Section 4 of this Act, this Act shall take effect July 1, 2003.
