## 2 Education - High School Diploma - Vietnam Conflict Veterans

- 18 (a) An individual honorably discharged from military service may apply to
- 19 obtain a high school diploma if the individual withdrew from a regular full-time
- 20 public or private school accredited by the State Board during the individual's senior
- 21 year in high school to enlist in the armed forces of the United States during:
- 22 (1) World War II [or the];
- 23 (2) THE Korean Conflict: OR
- 24 (3) THE VIETNAM CONFLICT.
- 25 (b) To obtain a high school diploma under subsection (a) of this section, the
- 26 individual shall apply to the county board in the county where the individual resides
- 27 or where the school from which the individual withdrew was located.
