2 **Dredge Deposits - Creation of Artificial Islands in the Chesapeake Bay -**  
3 **Prohibited Use as Part of Management Plan**

4 FOR the purpose of prohibiting the deposit of dredged material to create artificial  
5 islands in the Chesapeake Bay from being part of the development or  
6 implementation of any plan or program for the management of dredged material  
7 or for the protection or development of the Chesapeake Bay; providing for the  
8 application of this Act; defining certain terms; and generally relating to the  
9 deposit of dredge material in the Chesapeake Bay for the purpose of creating  
10 artificial islands.

21 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
22 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

25 (A) (1) IN THIS SECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS  
26 INDICATED.

1 (2) "ARTIFICIAL ISLAND" MEANS ANY NEW ISLAND CREATED OR  
2 FORMED BY THE MECHANICAL DUMPING OR DEPOSITING OF DREDGE MATERIAL IN  
3 THE CHESAPEAKE BAY.

4 (3) "HISTORICAL NATURAL ISLAND" MEANS A GEOLOGICAL FOOTPRINT  
5 OF AN ISLAND THAT ONCE EXISTED IN THE WATERS OF THE CHESAPEAKE BAY AND  
6 HAS BEEN SEVERELY DAMAGED OR DIMINISHED DUE TO EXTENSIVE EROSION.

7 (B) (1) THIS SUBSECTION MAY NOT BE INTERPRETED TO PROHIBIT OR  
8 RESTRICT THE DEPOSIT OF DREDGED MATERIAL TO RESTORE OR REPAIR A  
9 HISTORICAL NATURAL ISLAND.

10 (2) THE DEPOSIT OF DREDGED MATERIAL TO CREATE ARTIFICIAL  
11 ISLANDS IN THE CHESAPEAKE BAY MAY NOT BE A PART OF THE DEVELOPMENT OR

16 (f) (1) (I) IN THIS SUBSECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE  
17 MEANINGS INDICATED.

18 (II) "ARTIFICIAL ISLAND" MEANS ANY NEW ISLAND CREATED OR  
19 FORMED BY THE MECHANICAL DUMPING OR DEPOSITING OF DREDGE MATERIAL IN  
20 THE CHESAPEAKE BAY.

21 (III) "HISTORICAL NATURAL ISLAND" MEANS A GEOLOGICAL  
22 FOOTPRINT OF AN ISLAND THAT ONCE EXISTED IN THE WATERS OF THE  
23 CHESAPEAKE BAY AND HAS BEEN SEVERELY DAMAGED OR DIMINISHED DUE TO  
24 EXTENSIVE EROSION.

25 (2) Nothing in this section shall impede or prevent the dredging of any  
26 waterway in a critical area. However, dredging in a critical area is subject to other  
27 applicable federal and State laws and regulations.

28 (3) (I) THIS PARAGRAPH MAY NOT BE INTERPRETED TO PROHIBIT OR  
29 RESTRICT THE DEPOSIT OF DREDGED MATERIAL TO RESTORE OR REPAIR A  
30 HISTORICAL NATURAL ISLAND.

31 (II) THE DEPOSIT OF DREDGED MATERIAL TO CREATE ARTIFICIAL  
32 ISLANDS IN THE CHESAPEAKE BAY MAY NOT BE A PART OF THE DEVELOPMENT OR  
33 IMPLEMENTATION OF ANY PLAN OR PROGRAM FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF DREDGED  
34 MATERIAL OR FOR THE PROTECTION OR DEVELOPMENT OF THE CHESAPEAKE BAY.

35 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect  
36 October 1, 2003.
