## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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### Advisory Committee to Study Expansion of the All-Payor System

3 FOR the purpose of establishing an Advisory Committee to Study Expansion of the

4 All-Payor System; providing for the composition of the Advisory Committee;

5 requiring the Advisory Committee to study the inclusion of certain health care

6 services under the All-Payor System; providing for the duties of the Advisory

7 Committee; requiring the Advisory Committee to elect a chairman from among

8 its members; providing for the staffing of the Advisory Committee; requiring the

9 Advisory Committee to meet at certain times; requiring the Advisory Committee

10 to contact the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services to gather certain

11 information; requiring the Advisory Committee to make a certain report by a

12 certain date; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to

13 an Advisory Committee to Study Expansion of the All-Payor System.

# 14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF15 MARYLAND, That:

16 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 17 July 1, 2003. It shall remain effective for a period of 6 months and, at the end of 18 December 31, 2003, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act 19 shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.

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
