3 4 5	(a) (1) In Washington County the operators of any amusement park, whether individual, association of individuals, or a corporation, may be entitled to a license for the sale of beer within the confines of its park.
8	(2) The fee for such license shall be one hundred dollars (\$100) each calendar year, and shall entitle the holder to sell beer at one or more locations within the park from 8 a.m. to 12 p.m. on every day from May 1 to September 30 of each year, except Sundays and election days.
12	(3) Such licensees shall be subject to all laws, rules and regulations applicable in Washington County to the sale of beer, not inconsistent with the provisions of this section; nothing contained in § 9-102 of this article shall apply to any license issued pursuant to this section.
14 15	(b) (1) A separate license, called a "pouring license" may be issued countywide by the Washington County Liquor Board.
16 17	(2) The holder of a "pouring license" may only sell alcoholic beverages for consumption on the premises.
18	(3) The annual fee for each "pouring license" is:
	(i) \$100 <u>\$350</u> for a beer license FOR PREMISES WITH A SEATING CAPACITY OF LESS THAN 75 AND \$350 FOR PREMISES WITH A SEATING CAPACITY OF 75 OR MORE;
	<ul> <li>(ii) \$150 <u>\$400</u> for a beer and light wine license FOR PREMISES WITH A SEATING CAPACITY OF LESS THAN 75 AND \$400 FOR PREMISES WITH A SEATING CAPACITY OF 75 OR MORE;</li> </ul>
	(iii) \$500 <u>\$750</u> for a beer, light wine, and liquor license <del>FOR</del> PREMISES WITH A SEATING CAPACITY OF LESS THAN 75 AND \$750 FOR PREMISES WITH A SEATING CAPACITY OF 75 OR MORE; and
	(iv) \$250 for a Sunday sale license FOR PREMISES WITH A SEATING CAPACITY OF LESS THAN 75 AND \$500 FOR PREMISES WITH A SEATING CAPACITY OF 75 OR MORE.
