- 17 THE COUNTY IS ACTING AS THE GENERAL CONTRACTOR, THE PURCHASE OR
- 18 CONTRACT MAY BE AWARDED AFTER THE COUNTY OBTAINS QUOTES FOR THE
- 19 PURCHASE OR CONTRACT FROM AT LEAST 3 VENDORS OR SUBCONTRACTORS.
