SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

23 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

2 **HOUSE BILL 894** 1 **Article - Insurance** 2 [15-704. Notwithstanding § 15-701(a) of this subtitle, unless a policy, contract, or 4 certificate described in § 15-701(a) of this subtitle expressly provides for 5 reimbursement for a service that is within the lawful scope of practice of a 6 professional counselor or professional counselor-marriage and family therapist 7 certified under the Health Occupations Article, the provisions of the Health 8 Occupations Article that govern the certification and regulation of professional 9 counselors and professional counselor-marriage and family therapists may not be 10 construed to entitle the insured or any other person covered by the policy, contract, or 11 certificate to reimbursement for the service.] 12 15-704. 13 (A) THIS SECTION APPLIES TO EACH INDIVIDUAL, GROUP, OR BLANKET 14 HEALTH INSURANCE POLICY, CONTRACT, OR CERTIFICATE OF AN INSURER OR 15 NONPROFIT HEALTH SERVICE PLAN THAT: IS DELIVERED OR ISSUED FOR DELIVERY IN THE STATE: 16 (1) (I) 17 IS ISSUED TO A GROUP THAT IS INCORPORATED OR HAS A MAIN (II)18 OFFICE IN THE STATE; OR 19 (III)COVERS INDIVIDUALS WHO RESIDE OR WORK IN THE STATE; **20 AND** 21 IS ISSUED, RENEWED, AMENDED, OR REISSUED ON OR AFTER (2) 22 OCTOBER 1, 2003. 23 (B) IF A POLICY, CONTRACT, OR CERTIFICATE SUBJECT TO THIS SECTION 24 PROVIDES FOR REIMBURSEMENT FOR A SERVICE THAT IS WITHIN THE LAWFUL 25 SCOPE OF PRACTICE OF A LICENSED CLINICAL PROFESSIONAL COUNSELOR, A 26 LICENSED CLINICAL MARRIAGE AND FAMILY THERAPIST, OR A LICENSED CLINICAL 27 ALCOHOL AND DRUG COUNSELOR, THE INSURED OR ANY OTHER PERSON COVERED
