## A BILL ENTITLED

1	AN	ACT	concerning
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- 2 Solid Waste Disposal Cathode Ray Tubes Computer Monitors and 3 Television Screens
- 4 FOR the purpose of prohibiting any person from disposing of a cathode ray tube from
- 5 a computer monitor or television screen in a sanitary landfill, solid waste
- 6 transfer station, or incinerator on or after a certain date; prohibiting any
- 7 sanitary landfill, solid waste transfer station, or incinerator from accepting a
- 8 cathode ray tube for disposal, transfer for disposal, or incineration on or after a
- certain date; requiring the Office of Recycling to study methods of recycling cathode ray tubes; requiring the Office of Recycling to develop a method for the
- management and recycling of used cathode ray tubes; authorizing the
- 12 Department of the Environment to adopt certain regulations; providing for
- certain penalties; and generally relating to the disposal of cathode ray tubes.

- 19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 20 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 21 Article Environment
- 22 9-227.1.
- 23 (A) (1) ON OR AFTER DECEMBER 31, 2004, A PERSON MAY NOT DISPOSE OF A
- 24 CATHODE RAY TUBE FROM A COMPUTER MONITOR OR TELEVISION SCREEN IN A
- 25 SANITARY LANDFILL, SOLID WASTE TRANSFER STATION, OR INCINERATOR, OR AT
- 26 ANY OTHER LOCATION NOT DESIGNATED FOR THE MANAGEMENT OR RECYCLING OF
- 27 CATHODE RAY TUBES BY THE DEPARTMENT.

- 1 (2) ON OR AFTER DECEMBER 31, 2004, A SANITARY LANDFILL, SOLID 2 WASTE TRANSFER STATION, OR INCINERATOR MAY NOT ACCEPT ANY CATHODE RAY 3 TUBE FOR DISPOSAL, TRANSFER FOR DISPOSAL, OR INCINERATION.
- 4 (B) (1) THE OFFICE OF RECYCLING SHALL STUDY FEASIBLE METHODS FOR 5 THE MANAGEMENT AND RECYCLING OF USED CATHODE RAY TUBES.
- 6 (2) IN STUDYING FEASIBLE METHODS FOR THE MANAGEMENT AND 7 RECYCLING OF USED CATHODE RAY TUBES, THE OFFICE OF RECYCLING SHALL
- 8 CONSULT WITH REPRESENTATIVES OF THE APPROPRIATE INDUSTRY, LOCAL
- 9 GOVERNMENTS, THE ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY, AND THE STATES IN 10 THE REGION, INCLUDING:
- 11 (I) DELAWARE;
- 12 (II) THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA;
- 13 (III) PENNSYLVANIA;
- 14 (IV) VIRGINIA; AND
- 15 (V) WEST VIRGINIA.
- 16 (3) THE OFFICE OF RECYCLING SHALL DEVELOP A METHOD FOR THE
- 17 MANAGEMENT AND RECYCLING OF USED CATHODE RAY TUBES BY DECEMBER 31,
- 18 2004.
- 19 (C) (1) THE DEPARTMENT MAY ADOPT REGULATIONS TO CARRY OUT THE 20 PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION.
- 21 (2) REGULATIONS ADOPTED BY THE DEPARTMENT IN ACCORDANCE
- 22 WITH PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION SHALL BE CONSISTENT WITH
- 23 ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY GUIDELINES AND WITH METHODS
- 24 DEVELOPED BY THE OFFICE OF RECYCLING UNDER SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS
- 25 SECTION.
- 26 (D) A PERSON WHO VIOLATES ANY PROVISION OF SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS
- 27 SECTION IS GUILTY OF A MISDEMEANOR AND ON CONVICTION IS SUBJECT TO A FINE
- 28 NOT EXCEEDING \$1,000 FOR EACH VIOLATION.
- 29 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 30 October 1, 2003.
