3 FOR the purpose of requiring certain owners and operators of facilities and vessels to

- 4 file a copy of a certain vulnerability assessment required under the federal
- 5 Maritime Transportation Security Act of 2002 with the Maryland Port
- 6 Administration; requiring the Administration to provide a certain report,
- 7 identifying certain risks to transportation security, to the General Assembly on
- 8 or before a certain date each year; specifying the contents of the report; and
- 9 generally relating to vulnerability assessments of port facilities.

- 15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 16 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Transportation

19 (A) AN OWNER OR OPERATOR OF A FACILITY OR VESSEL WITHIN THE
20 TERRITORIAL JURISDICTION OF THE ADMINISTRATION THAT IS SUBJECT TO A
21 VULNERABILITY ASSESSMENT UNDER THE FEDERAL MARITIME TRANSPORTATION
22 SECURITY ACT OF 2002 SHALL FILE A COPY OF THE VULNERABILITY ASSESSMENT
23 WITH THE ADMINISTRATION.

(B) ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 1 OF EACH YEAR, THE ADMINISTRATION, IN
ACCORDANCE WITH § 2-1246 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, SHALL PROVIDE
AN ANNUAL REPORT TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY BASED ON THE INFORMATION
GATHERED UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION, IDENTIFYING RISKS TO
TRANSPORTATION SECURITY, INCLUDING:

- 1 (1) PROPOSED SAFETY STANDARDS TO ADDRESS IDENTIFIED RISKS;
- A TIME LINE FOR IMPLEMENTING PROPOSED STANDARDS; AND 2 (2)

3 (3) ESTIMATES OF THE IMPLEMENTATION COSTS, ALLOCATED 4 BETWEEN THE STATE AND PRIVATE INDUSTRY.

5 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 6 October 1, 2003.
