- 16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## 1 Article - Health - General 2 15-124. 3 The Department shall maintain a Maryland Pharmacy Assistance (a) (1) 4 Program for low income individuals whose: 5 Assets are not more than 1.5 times the amount of accountable (i) 6 resources according to the asset schedule of the Maryland Medical Assistance 7 Program: and 8 (ii) Gross annual income does not exceed: 9 1. \$4,600 plus \$500 for each individual over 1 in a family 10 unit; and 11 2. An annual increase set by the Secretary under paragraph 12 (2)(ii)4 of this subsection. 13 Reimbursement under the Maryland Pharmacy Assistance (1) 14 Program may be limited to maintenance drugs, anti-infectives, and AZT as specified 15 in regulations to be issued by the Secretary after consultation with the Maryland 16 Pharmacists Association. 17 (ii) 1. For any drug on the Program's interchangeable drug list, 18 the Program shall reimburse providers in an amount not more than it would 19 reimburse for the drug's generic equivalent, unless the individual's physician states, 20 in his or her own handwriting, on the face of the prescription, that a specific brand is 21 "medically necessary" for the particular patient. 22 If an appropriate generic drug is not generally available, 23 the Department may waive the reimbursement requirement under 24 sub-subparagraph 1 of this subparagraph. 25 The reimbursement shall be up to the amount paid for the same 26 items or services under the pharmacy program of the Maryland Medical Assistance 27 Program and shall be subject to a copayment of not more than [\$5.00 for each covered 28 item or service]: 29 \$2.50 FOR A GENERIC DRUG OR A BRAND NAME DRUG ON A (I) 30 PREFERRED DRUG LIST ESTABLISHED BY THE DEPARTMENT; AND \$7.50 FOR A BRAND NAME DRUG NOT ON A PREFERRED DRUG 31 (II)32 LIST ESTABLISHED BY THE DEPARTMENT. 33 SECTION 2.
