- 1 (b) A pedestrian may not suddenly leave a curb or other place of safety and 2 walk or run into the path of a vehicle which is so close that it is impossible for the 3 driver to yield.
- 4 (c) If, at a marked crosswalk or at an unmarked crosswalk at an intersection, 5 a vehicle is stopped to let a pedestrian cross the roadway, the driver of any other 6 vehicle approaching from the rear may not overtake and pass the stopped vehicle.
- 7 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 8 October 1, 2003.
