CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Carroll County - Disposition of Personal Property**

3 FOR the purpose of increasing the dollar amount of certain personal property that the
4 Board of County Commissioners of Carroll County may dispose of by certain
5 means; and otherwise relating to the disposition of personal property by the
6 Commissioners.

7 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

14 **Article 25 - County Commissioners**

15 11A.

16 (g) Notwithstanding subsection (a) of this section, in Carroll County, provided
17 that the supplies, equipment, or other personal property are valued at less than
18 [\$100] \$250, the Board of County Commissioners of Carroll County may dispose of
19 surplus supplies, equipment, or other personal property belonging to the county by
20 the following means:

21 (1) Public auction;

1 (2) Public sale, provided that the sale is advertised through a press
2 release or public notice in a media accessible to the general public;

3 (3) Transfer to a State, municipal, or county government agency;

4 (4) Transfer to a private nonprofit corporation that is authorized to
5 receive appropriations from the county, provided that the private nonprofit
6 corporation is an exempt organization as defined in § 501(c)(3) of Title 26 of the
7 United States Code;

8 (5) Deposit at the swap shop at the Northern Landfill; or

9 (6) Disposal in a solid waste disposal facility.

10 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
11 October 1, 2003.
