1 Article 49D - Office for Children, Youth, and Families 2 2. 3 The Special Secretary of the Office for Children, Youth, and Families is (a) 4 responsible for overseeing the general policy for children, youth, and family services 5 in the State. The policy shall be to promote a stable, safe, and healthy 6 (b) (1) 7 environment for children and families, thereby increasing self-sufficiency and family 8 preservation. This requires a comprehensive, coordinated interagency approach to (2)10 provide a continuum of care that is family and child oriented and emphasizes 11 prevention, early intervention, and community-based services.
