CHAPTER 1 AN ACT concerning 2 Task Force to Study the Availability of Audiology and Speech-Language 3 **Services** 4 FOR the purpose of establishing the Task Force to Study the Availability of Audiology and Speech-Language Services; specifying the composition, powers, and duties 5 of the Task Force; providing for the staffing of the Task Force; requiring the 6 Task Force to report its findings and recommendations to certain committees of 7 8 the General Assembly by a certain date; providing for the termination of this 9 Act; and generally relating to the Task Force to Study the Availability of Audiology and Speech-Language Services. 10 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 11 12 MARYLAND, That:

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 27 July 1, 2003. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and, at the end of June 30, 28 2004, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be 29 abrogated and of no further force and effect.
