12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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Article - Election Law

16 (A) (1) THERE IS A MARYLAND ELECTION MODERNIZATION FUND.

17 (2) THE FUND IS ESTABLISHED AS A CONTINUING FUND FOR PROGRAMS
 18 RELATING TO THE FEDERAL HELP AMERICA VOTE ACT OF 2002 AND RELATED
 19 EXPENDITURES.

20(3)THE FUND IS A SPECIAL, CONTINUING, NONLAPSING FUND THAT IS21NOT SUBJECT TO § 7-302 OF THE STATE FINANCE AND PROCUREMENT ARTICLE.

(4) THE TREASURER SHALL SEPARATELY HOLD AND THE COMPTROLLERSHALL ACCOUNT FOR THE FUND.

(5) THE FUND SHALL BE INVESTED AND REINVESTED IN THE SAME25 MANNER AS OTHER STATE FUNDS.

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1(6)ANY INVESTMENT EARNINGS SHALL BE RETAINED TO THE CREDIT2OF THE FUND.

3 (B) THE FUND CONSISTS OF:

4 (1) MONEYS APPROPRIATED IN THE STATE BUDGET TO THE FUND;

5 (2) MONEYS OTHERWISE APPROPRIATED FOR THE PURPOSES OF THE
6 FUND, WHICH MAY BE TRANSFERRED TO THE FUND BY AN APPROVED BUDGET
7 AMENDMENT; AND

8 (3) MONEYS RECEIVED BY THE STATE FROM THE FEDERAL
9 GOVERNMENT UNDER THE FEDERAL HELP AMERICA VOTE ACT OF 2002 OR UNDER
10 OTHER FEDERAL PROGRAMS FOR SIMILAR PURPOSES.

11 (C) EXPENDITURES FROM THE FUND MAY BE MADE ONLY IN ACCORDANCE 12 WITH AN APPROPRIATION FOR:

13 (1) COMPLYING WITH REQUIREMENTS OF THE FEDERAL HELP AMERICA 14 VOTE ACT OF 2002;

15(2)IMPROVING THE ADMINISTRATION OF ELECTIONS FOR FEDERAL16 OFFICE;

17 (3) EDUCATING VOTERS REGARDING VOTING PROCEDURES, VOTING 18 RIGHTS, AND VOTING TECHNOLOGY;

19(4)TRAINING ELECTION OFFICIALS, POLL WORKERS, AND ELECTION20 VOLUNTEERS;

21 (5) DEVELOPING THE STATE PLAN REQUIRED BY THE FEDERAL HELP 22 AMERICA VOTE ACT OF 2002;

(6) IMPROVING, ACQUIRING, LEASING, MODIFYING, OR REPLACING
 VOTING SYSTEMS AND TECHNOLOGY AND METHODS FOR CASTING AND COUNTING
 VOTES;

(7) IMPROVING THE QUANTITY AND ACCESSIBILITY OF POLLING
PLACES, INCLUDING PROVIDING PHYSICAL ACCESS FOR INDIVIDUALS WITH
DISABILITIES, NONVISUAL ACCESS FOR INDIVIDUALS WITH VISUAL IMPAIRMENTS,
AND ACCESS FOR INDIVIDUALS WITH LIMITED PROFICIENCY IN THE ENGLISH
LANGUAGE;

(8) ESTABLISHING TOLL-FREE TELEPHONE HOTLINES THAT VOTERS
 MAY USE TO REPORT POSSIBLE VOTING FRAUD AND VOTING RIGHTS VIOLATIONS, TO
 OBTAIN GENERAL ELECTION INFORMATION, AND TO ACCESS DETAILED AUTOMATED
 INFORMATION ON THEIR OWN VOTER REGISTRATION STATUS, SPECIFIC POLLING
 PLACE LOCATIONS, AND OTHER RELEVANT INFORMATION; AND

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1(9)ANY OTHER USES THAT MAY BE ALLOWED FOR FUNDS RECEIVED2UNDER THE FEDERAL HELP AMERICA VOTE ACT OF 2002.
