17 18	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

21	(a) In addition to the powers set forth elsewhere in this title, the Board may:
22	(1) Adopt rules and regulations to carry out the provisions of this title;
	(2) [Adopt] SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION, ADOPT standards of practice and a code of ethics for the practice of physical therapy and limited physical therapy; and

6 (3) Adopt rules and regulations that govern the use of a physical therapy 7 aide by a licensed physical therapist.

8 (C) (1) A PHYSICAL THERAPIST MAY EVALUATE, TREAT, OR BOTH EVALUATE
9 AND TREAT, NOT MORE THAN AN AVERAGE OF FOUR PATIENTS PER CLINICAL
10 TREATMENT HOUR, EXCLUDING GROUP THERAPY.

(2) A PHYSICAL THERAPIST ASSISTANT MAY TREAT NOT MORE THAN AN
 AVERAGE OF FOUR PATIENTS PER CLINICAL TREATMENT HOUR, EXCLUDING GROUP
 THERAPY.
