BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 6 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 7 **Article - Health - General** 8 19-201. In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated. 9 (a) 10 (b) "Commission" means the State Health Services Cost Review Commission. 11 19-203. 12 (a) (1) The Commission consists of 7 members appointed by the Governor. 13 (2)Of the 7 members, 4 shall be individuals who do not have any 14 connection with the management or policy of any facility. 15 Each member shall be interested in problems of health care. (b) 16 (c) (1) The term of a member is 4 years. 17 (2) The terms of members are staggered as required by the terms 18 provided for members of the Commission on July 1, 1982. The terms of those members 19 end as follows: 20 (i) 2 in 1983; 21 1 in 1984; (ii) 22 2 in 1985; and (iii) 2 in 1986. 23 (iv) 24 At the end of a term, a member continues to serve until a successor is (3) 25 appointed and qualifies. A member who is appointed after a term has begun serves only for 26 (4) 27 the rest of the term and until a successor is appointed and qualifies. 28 A member who serves 2 consecutive full 4-year terms may not be 29 reappointed for 4 years after completion of those terms. WHEN APPOINTING A MEMBER TO FILL A VACANCY DUE TO THE 31 EXPIRATION OF A MEMBER'S TERM, THE GOVERNOR SHALL GIVE PRIORITY TO
