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Maryland Public Secondary School Athletic Association Members -Coaching Personnel - Hiring

4 FOR the purpose of requiring public schools that are members of the Maryland Public

- 5 Secondary School Athletic Association to follow certain provisions for hiring
- 6 coaching personnel; requiring member schools to employ on a priority basis, as
- 7 coaches only, certain employees of the county board of education; providing that
- 8 a noncertificated employee of the county board can <u>may</u> be hired for a coaching
- 9 position if certain employees are not qualified or not available; providing that
- 10 certain terms shall be addressed by the county board and within employee
- 11 contracts; providing that temporary emergency coaches can <u>may</u> be employed by
- 12 member schools if certain conditions are met using certain procedures; and
- 13 generally relating to the hiring of coaching personnel by schools that are
- 14 members of the Maryland Public Secondary School Athletic Association.

HOUSE BILL 1086

1 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

2 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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Article - Education

4 2-205.

5 (c) (1) [The] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN § 6-107.1 OF THIS ARTICLE, THE State
6 Board shall adopt bylaws, rules, and regulations for the administration of the public
7 schools.

8 (2) These bylaws, rules, and regulations have the force of law when 9 adopted and published.

10 (3) The bylaws, rules, and regulations apply to each county. However, 11 they do not apply to Baltimore City to the extent that they relate to matters that are 12 the subject of other provisions of this article that do not apply to Baltimore City.

14 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "MEMBER SCHOOLS" MEANS PUBLIC SCHOOLS THAT
15 ARE MEMBERS OF THE MARYLAND PUBLIC SECONDARY SCHOOLS ATHLETIC
16 ASSOCIATION.

17 (B) MEMBER SCHOOLS SHALL COMPLY WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THIS18 SECTION FOR HIRING COACHING PERSONNEL.

(C) MEMBER SCHOOLS SHALL EMPLOY, ON A PRIORITY BASIS AND AS
 COACHES ONLY, TEACHERS OR CERTIFICATED PROFESSIONAL EDUCATOR
 EMPLOYEES OF THE COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION FOR A SPECIFIC COACHING
 ASSIGNMENT.

23 (D) (1) IF A TEACHER OR A CERTIFICATED PROFESSIONAL EDUCATOR
24 EMPLOYEE OF THE COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION IS NOT QUALIFIED OR NOT
25 AVAILABLE, A NONCERTIFICATED EMPLOYEE OF THE COUNTY BOARD MAY BE
26 EMPLOYED FOR A COACHING POSITION.

(2) THE TERMS GOVERNING EMPLOYMENT, PAYMENT, AND
28 EVALUATION WITH JUST CAUSE OF NONCERTIFICATED EMPLOYEES HIRED FOR A
29 COACHING POSITION SHALL BE ADDRESSED BY THE COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION
30 AND WITHIN EMPLOYEE CONTRACTS.

31 (E) USING THE PROCEDURES SET FORTH IN COMAR 13A.06.03.04B(2), MEMBER
32 SCHOOLS MAY EMPLOY TEMPORARY EMERGENCY COACHES IF NO ACCEPTABLE AND
33 QUALIFIED COACHES ARE AVAILABLE FROM THE FOLLOWING PERSONNEL
34 EMPLOYED BY THE COUNTY BOARD:

35 (1) TEACHERS;

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1 (2) CERTIFIABLE CERTIFICATED PROFESSIONAL EDUCATOR TEACHERS 2 EMPLOYEES; OR

3 (3) NONCERTIFIABLE NONCERTIFICATED FULL-TIME EMPLOYEES.

4 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 5 July 1, 2003.
